Just from the downed trees and branches it looks like Georgia lost 20-25% of the pecan crop, and that doesn't include the nuts that fell.

In Tallahassee, trees are down everywhere and so are power lines. Our power went off at 2pm Wednesday and was restored at 1:30 this morning.

We arrived at home about 5pm and fired up a generator and picked up branches and things. Amazingly, the frozen food was still frozen and we didn't find any damage to the house.

Bob Stout's Honor Flight


I don't know how many of you have been on an Honor Flight to Washington, DC to visit the military memorials. If you haven't, you need to sign up for a once-in-a-lifetime experience that you will never forget. The patriotism displayed by our fellow Americans honoring World War II, Korean and Vietnam War veterans is truly a humbling experience. My 21/2 year wait was well worth it. All of our expenses were paid by Honor Flight Nevada. (even travel toiletries, snacks and dinner cocktails. We also were given shirts and sweatshirts for the trip and a box of gifts from Blue Star Mothers and Nevada schoolchildren.

Accompanying the trip on were "Guardians" for veterans with handicaps and a medic from the Reno Fire Department. Hundreds well-wishers lined passageways at all of the airports cheering, thanking us for our service and shaking our hands. Our group of 48 breezed right through TSA with TSA employees and airport security personnel expediting the boarding of our flights ahead of all other passengers. When we reached Baltimore, we stopped short of the gate while an airport fire truck saluted us with their water cannon spraying the plane.



Each day started at 0400 and travel from Reno to Washington, DC and back took a full day each way. No sleep just like being back in the Navy again! At mail call, we received letters from Nevada schoolchildren thanking us for our service and requesting we write to them answering questions about our military service. On Saturday we had a whirlwind tour of the Navy, Marine and Air Force memorials, along with Arlington National Cemetery, Iwo Jima, World War II, Korea, and Vietnam War memorials. At the National Cemetery we were greeted by a Rear Admiral and a two star Army general and given a front row location for the changing of the guard at the tomb of the Unknown Soldier. Our four World War II veterans participated in the ceremony by laying a wreath at the tomb. Moving on to the World War II Memorial we were mobbed by 30 or 40 young off-duty Marines shaking our hands and thanking us for our service. As an enlisted man it took some getting used to being saluted at the memorials by senior officers. We found out at the end of the trip that the "Guardian" we knew as Bill Burks was actually Brigadier General William R. Burks the Adjutant General for the State of Nevada and the highest ranking officer in the Nevada National Guard. When asked why he didn't let us know earlier he replied "this trip is about you guys not me".
